STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

In the 1920's and 30's, when travel by automobile became common, North Clarendon was developed as a tourist service area. This gas station is one of the few remaining structures in the village associated with this early roadside development along old Route 7. The building's small size reflects its initial use as a filling station, rather than auto repair and service center, a concept in gas station design that did not become widespread until the World War II era.
