

Clarendon War of 1812 Soldiers

Baxter, Thomas (1787 – May 23, 1849) -- Served in Capt. Needham's Company, Col. Martindale's Regiment. Detached Militia in U.S. service 2 months and 13 days 1812. Enlisted Sept. 21, 1813 in Capt. Daniel Farrington's Company, 30th Regiment. Transferred to 31st Regiment. Buried Chippenhook Cemetery. Married to Betsy Weaver.

Chapman, Joseph -- Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 4 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company.

Congdon, Joseph - Served in Capt. Needham's Company, Col. Martindale's Regiment. Detached Militia in U.S. service 2 months and 14 days 1812.

Crary, Nathan (1791 – Oct. 11, 1861) – Born in Clarendon, relocated to Potsdam, NY 1806, served in war in NY. Buried Pierrepont Hill Cemetery, Pierrepont, St. Lawrence, NY. Married to Catharine Averill. Father Nathan came to Clarendon in 1758. He served in Rev. War.

Crary, Oren (1796 – March 31, 1871) - Born in Clarendon, relocated to Potsdam, NY 1806, served in war in NY. Buried Pierrepont Hill Cemetery, Pierrepont, St. Lawrence, NY. Married to Laura Clark. Father Nathan came to Clarendon in 1768. He served in Rev. War.

Drake, Corporal Daniel – Served from Jan. 16, 1815 to June 19, 1815 in Capt. Taylor's Company, 30th Infantry. Received pension.

Eastman, Daniel (June 2, 1791 – May 17, 1874). Born in Clarendon, died in Sherman, Chautauqua, NY. Was living there by 1840. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Widow Tryphena (Loomis) collected pension.

Eddy, Sergeant Corporal John (March 21, 1789 – Oct. 18, 1865) – Born in Clarendon, died in Harmony, Chautauqua, NY. Was living there by 1830. Served in Capt. Sabin's Company, Col. Jonathan Williams' Regiment. Detached Militia in U.S. service 2 months and 6 days 1812. Served from June 11 to June 14, 1813 and from Oct. 4 to Oct. 13, 1813 in Capt. John Palmer's Company of Militia, 1st Regt. 2nd Brigade, 3rd Division. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried Blockville Union Burial Ground, Blockville, Chautauqua, NY. Married to Mary Sawyer.

Eddy, Peleg (July 27, 1794 – Feb. 15, 1862) - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried Clarendon Flats Cemetery. Married to 1st Sabrina Bromley and 2nd Sally Eastman.

Edmunds, James - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 4 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company.

Ewing, Corporal Daniel Sullivan (Jan. 27, 1787 – June 17, 1862) – Born in Pittsford, died in Clarendon. Was living in Clarendon by 1809. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried in Chippenhook Cemetery. Married 1st Harriet Thankful Tuttle, 2nd Sara Eliza Tuttle, 3rd Mary (Polly) Parsons.

French, Seba - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 4 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company.

Glynn, Samuel A. – (2-3-1795 – 6-16-1852) Served 1813-1815 in the NY militia under Capt. Daniel St. John. He was living in Clarendon by 1818 when he married Mary A. Eddy here.

Gould, Samuel (1792 – May 17, 1874) - Born in Clarendon, died in Goshen, VT. Living in Pittsford by 1831 and Goshen by 1870. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Married to Ida A. ____

Green, Alanson - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company

Green, Sergeant Walter (July 27, 1781 - Jan. 25, 1848) - Served in Capt. Needham's Company, Col. Martindale's Regiment . Detached Militia in U.S. service 2 months and 14 days 1812. Buried Chippenhook Cemetery. Widow Lovina (Colvin) received a pension.

Harrington, Joshua (March 10, 1785 – Nov. 18, 1849) - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 4 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company as a teamster. Buried Chippenhook Cemetery. Married to Lydia Blanchard.

McCay, David - Served in Capt. Needham's Company, Col. Martindale's Regiment. Detached Militia in U.S. service 2 months and 14 days 1812.

Nourse, Timothy (Aug. 7, 1781 – Jan. 7, 1864) – Born in Barre, Worcester, MA, then to Shrewsbury by 1810, Clarendon by 1820, and then Orange, Franklin, MA by 1850. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814 and served 4 days in Capt. Robert Reed's Company. Also served in Capt. N. Crary's Company. Buried Highland Cemetery, Athol, Worcester, MA. Married 1st Patty ____, 2nd to Lucretia Miller Flint who received a pension.

Palmer, Allen (1781 -) – Musician, served in Capt. Brown's Company, Col. Martindale's Regiment. Detached Militia in U.S. service 2 months and 14 days in 1812.

Parker, Jonathan – Enlisted Aug. 20, 1813 for 1 year and served in Capt. Daniel Farrington's Company (also commanded by Capt. Simeon Wright) 30th Regiment. On Muster Roll from March 1 to April 30, 1814. Served from Sept. 1, 1814 to June 16, 1815 in Capt. Sanford's Company 30th Infantry. Received pension.

Parker, Capt. Rufus (Oct. 1785 - Feb. 24, 1859) – Born Rindge, Cheshire, NH, came to Clarendon as an infant. Served as Private in Capt. Needham's Company, Col. Martindale's Regiment. Detached Militia in

U.S. service 2 months and 14 days 1812. Enlisted May 1, 1813 for 1 year in Capt. Daniel Farrington's Company, 30th Regiment (also commanded by Capt. Simeon Wright). On Muster Roll March 1 to April 30, 1814. Buried East Clarendon Cemetery. Married to Eunice Titus.

Peck, Hiram - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company.

Peck, Noah (March 31, 1765 – Aug. 19, 1842) – Born in Rhode Island, living in Clarendon by 1800. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried Chippenhook Cemetery. Married to Mehitable Yaw.

Perkins, Moses - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814 and served 4 days in Capt. Robert Reed's Company. Was living in Shrewsbury 1810 census and then in Clarendon by 1820.

Potter, David (March 30, 1764 – May 13, 1846) – Born in Glocester, Providence, RI, was living in Clarendon by 1790. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Also served in 4th Regiment (Williams) Vermont Militia. Buried Chippenhook Cemetery. Was married to Phebe Potter (Potter was her maiden name).

Potter, Noel – Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company.

Round, Lensey (July 13, 1785 – Jan. 20, 1867) - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried Chippenhook Cemetery. Married to 1st Seviah Horton, 2nd to Polly_____

Round, Orderly Sergeant Ozial H. - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company.

Round, Robert I. (March 7, 1784 – ca. 1872)- Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Living Lockport, Niagara, NY by 1850. Died Lockport. Married to Samantha Hutchins.

Seamans, Charles (May 6, 1764 - April 21, 1847) – Born in Scituate, RI, was living in Clarendon by 1786. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried Chippenhook Cemetery. Married to Mehitable Osborn.

Seamans, Sergeant Daniel (Feb. 2, 1794 – Jan. 28, 1861) – Born in Clarendon, was living in Hartland, Niagara, NY by 1820. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried Johnson Creek Baptist Cemetery, Niagara Co., NY. Married to Amy Olin.

Smith, Levi - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company.

Smith, Reuben (Feb. 23, 1786 – Jan. 13, 1844) - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 4 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried Pleasant St. Cemetery, West Rutland, VT. Married to Naomi Ewing.

Sprague, Captain Durham (June 8, 1770 – ca. Sept. 1834) - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 4 days in command of Company from Clarendon. Married Mary Marcy.

Tower, Lieutenant Thomas (May 12, 1784 – July 13, 1863) – Born in Manchester, VT, was living in Ira by 1860 where he died. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company. Buried Riverside Cemetery, Ira, VT. Married to Mary (Polly) McCoy. Was Deacon of the Ira Baptist Church.

Tuttle, Chauncy D. - Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company.

Tuttle, Capt. Ebenezer Prime Jr. (Jan. 28, 1788 – Oct. 4, 1829) – Born in Rutland, came to Clarendon as an infant. Volunteered to go to Plattsburgh Sept. 1814, and served 7 days in Capt. Durham Sprague's Company as a teamster. Buried Chippenhook Cemetery. Married 1st Nancy Smith, 2nd Roxana Smith.

White, Alexander (Dec. 27, 1792 – July 7, 1876) – Born in Shrewsbury, was living in Clarendon by 1820. Served in Capt. Needham's Company, Col. Martindale's Regiment. Detached Militia in U.S. service 2 months and 14 days 1812. Buried East Clarendon Cemetery. Married 1st Polly Ann Smith, 2nd Fanny Burgess who received a pension.

Williams, Cato (ca. 1782 – Apr. 24, 1834) – Born in Massachusetts, was living in Clarendon by 1800 and in Lenox, Berkshire, MA by 1820. Served in Capt. Samuel H. Holly's Company, 11th Regiment. On Pay Roll for January and February 1813. Received pension. Died in Williamstown, Berkshire, MA. Married Polly Eldridge.
